Provider Spotlight Nathalia Medina, 123 Bambino & Family Home Provider, Yakima

Running your own home-based child care small business can be stressful. Being director of a brand new child care center can also be challenging. Doing both during the COVID-19 outbreak could easily be



overwhelming. But Nathalia Medina is taking it all in stride, providing great care to the little ones in her new center, Bambino 123, and the young and school-aged children in her home program, helping their parents manage stress and staying on top of extra disinfecting while remaining a strong voice for children and families in her community.

"What is going on is serious, but don't panic," she says. She wants to stay open to help those parents, including some who are essential workers, who simply cannot work from home. She says she experienced very difficult times in her life when she needed to work and there was no child care available for her children. Nathalia intends to not let that happen to the families she provides care for.

One of the ways Nathalia demonstrates her commitment to young children and families is by participating in Early Achievers and making the most out of the resources it provides. Nathalia says she is grateful for her Child Care Aware of Washington Early Achievers coach, and has benefited from the program's Needs-Based Grants that allowed her to get great early learning toys.

Another way Nathalia tries to make things better for children and families is by being a child care advocate. Every year during Washington's legislative session, Nathalia travels to Olympia to make sure her legislators understand the issues important to child care and the thousands of families that rely on it.

Updated Early Achievers Operating Guidelines

The Washington State Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) recently updated the Early Achievers Operating Guidelines. The updates include:

- Information about the Level 3+ rating
- System updates outlined in legislation [that are already in effect]
- Updated tiered reimbursement rates

Official Definition of Early Achievers Level 3+

DCYF has released the official description for Early Achievers Level 3+.

"Level 3+ programs have achieved higher scores in their environment and interaction assessments and have typically implemented higher-level practices. Examples of higher-level practices may vary by site, and may include a high-quality curriculum and individualized instruction for all children. Level 3+ providers are actively demonstrating quality in their programs through high-quality interactions with children and engaging learning environments."

Child Care Injuries Are Preventable

The Washington State Department of Labor & Industries created a new flier for child care providers about preventing child care workplace injuries. The flier explains the real costs to child care programs when someone is injured at work.
