

Child Care in Douglas County



January 2021

In most parts of Washington, the number of child care providers declined from 2008-2013, becoming more stable from 2014-2020 although still in decline at a lesser rate. Capacity for children declined from 2008-2013, however due to more family child care closures than center-based care, capacity has risen from 2014-2019. There is a dip in number of providers and capacity in 2020. This may be understated because as of June 2020, 27% of child care capacity was temporarily closed due to COVID and based on our surveys of child care providers, some of these site will not re-open.

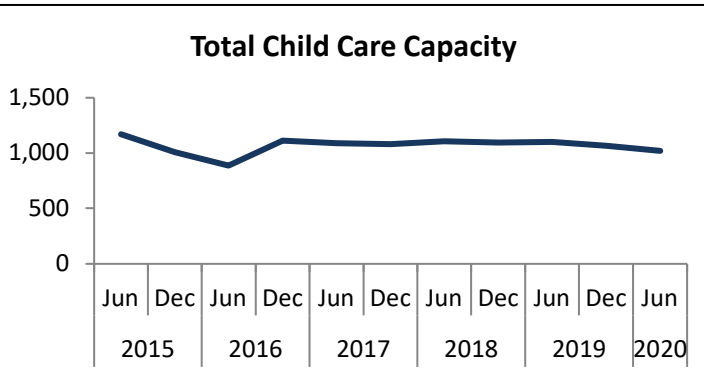
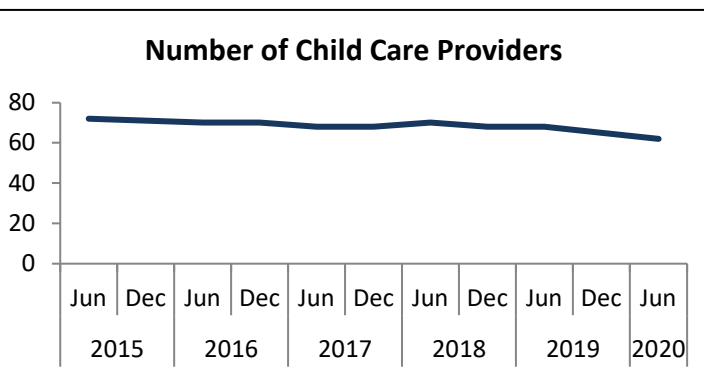
Child Care Aware of Washington provides thorough and independent information and support:

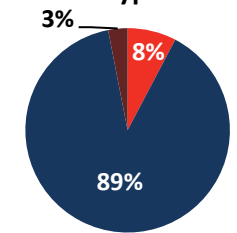
Since 1989, our regional member programs and statewide Family Center have enhanced the quality of child care and helped families by:

- Delivering training, technical assistance, & consultation to child care providers
- Supplying families with consumer education & referrals for child care

In Douglas County, the number of child care providers has dropped from 72 with capacity for 1172 children in 2015, to 62 providers with capacity for 1019 children in June of 2020.*

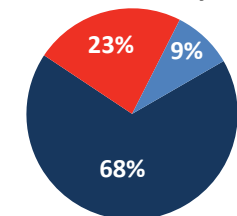


Child Care Provider Type

Early Achievers

Early Achievers is Washington's **Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS)**, which gives training, technical assistance, coaching, awards, scholarships, and other benefits to child care providers **to improve the quality of their care.**

Statewide, 3,831 child care providers participate in Early Achievers.

Approximately 83% of licensed child care providers in Douglas County are enrolled in Early Achievers. Early Achievers provides families with valuable child care program quality information so they can make informed child care choices.

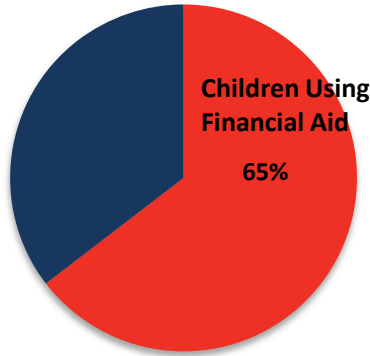

Helping Families Find Child Care in 2019

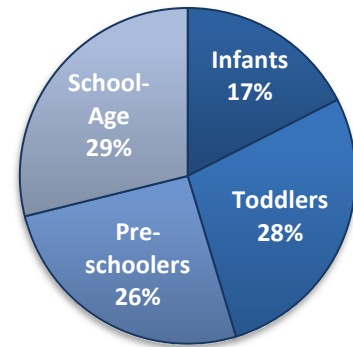
In 2019, Child Care Aware of Washington programs helped 9,759 families find child care providers matching their unique needs.

In Douglas County alone, we helped 66 families with 96 children in need of child care to search for matching providers 86 times.
