## **Skagit County**



#### March 2023

In most parts of Washington, the number of child care providers declined from 2008-2013, becoming more stable from 2014-2020 although still in decline at a lesser rate. Capacity for children declined from 2008-2013, however due to more family child care closures than center-based care, capacity has risen from 2014-2019. Since the pandemic there has been a net loss of nearly 150 providers and around 1,500 slots. This decline has disproportionately impacted communities based on location. In the net loss of providers, nearly 40% are center-based, representing 60% of the capacity lost.





In Skagit County, the number of child care providers has dropped from 97 with capacity for 2,390 children in 2018, to 89 providers with capacity for 2,368 children in December of 2022.\*





#### **Early Achievers**

Early Achievers is Washington's **Quality Recognition and Improvement System** (QRIS), which gives training, technical assistance, coaching, awards, scholarships, and other benefits to child care providers **to improve the quality of their care**.

## Statewide, 4,225 child care providers participate in Early Achievers.

Approximately 84% of licensed child care providers in Skagit County are enrolled in Early Achievers. Early Achievers provides families with valuable child care program quality information so they can make informed child care choices.




