

Child Care in

King County

Statewide during the past 12 years, Washington has gained over 20,000 slots and decreased by 2,000 providers. The increases in capacity are a result of more family child care closures and larger centers opening. Since 2022, Washington has seen an increase of 500 family child care programs and 70 centers. Current gains in providers are encouraging, however we have significantly less providers than 12 years ago. The trend of less providers and more capacity being available at large centers has contributed to child care deserts, as the number of child care locations has decreased. Moreover, communities across the state have experienced differential outcomes in child care availability as some areas experienced greater child care decreases and in some cases lowered capacity.





In King County, the number of child care providers has increased from 2,047 with capacity for 68,392 children in 2019, to 2,431 providers with capacity for 80,979 children in December of 2023.*





Early Achievers

Early Achievers is Washington's **Quality Recognition and Improvement System** (QRIS), which gives training, technical assistance, coaching, awards, scholarships, and other benefits to child care providers **to improve the quality of their care**.

Statewide, 4,628 child care providers participate in Early Achievers.

Approximately 75% of licensed child care providers in King County are enrolled in Early Achievers. Early Achievers provides families with valuable child care program quality information so they can make informed child care choices.



In 2023, Child Care Aware of Washington programs have helped 12,199 families find child care providers matching their unique needs.

In King County alone, we helped 3558 families with 4413 children in need of child care to search for matching providers 5214 times.
