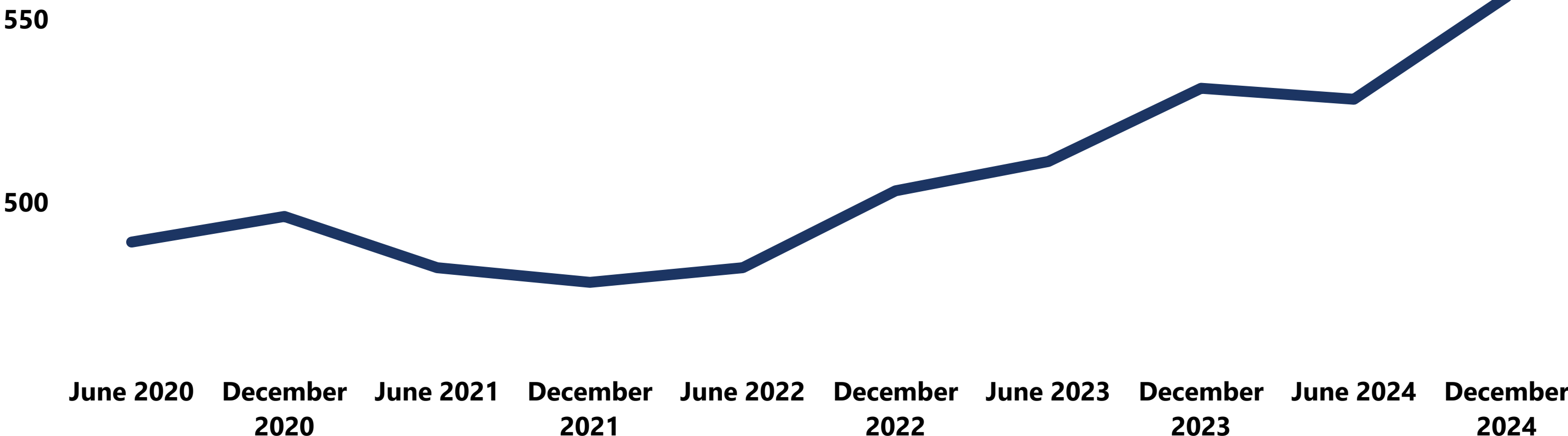

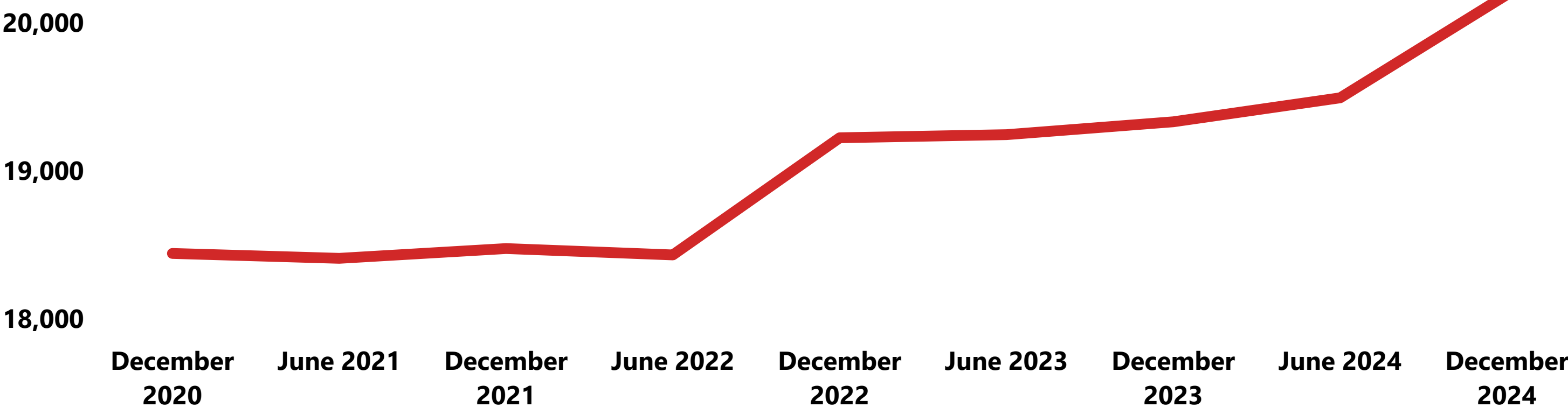

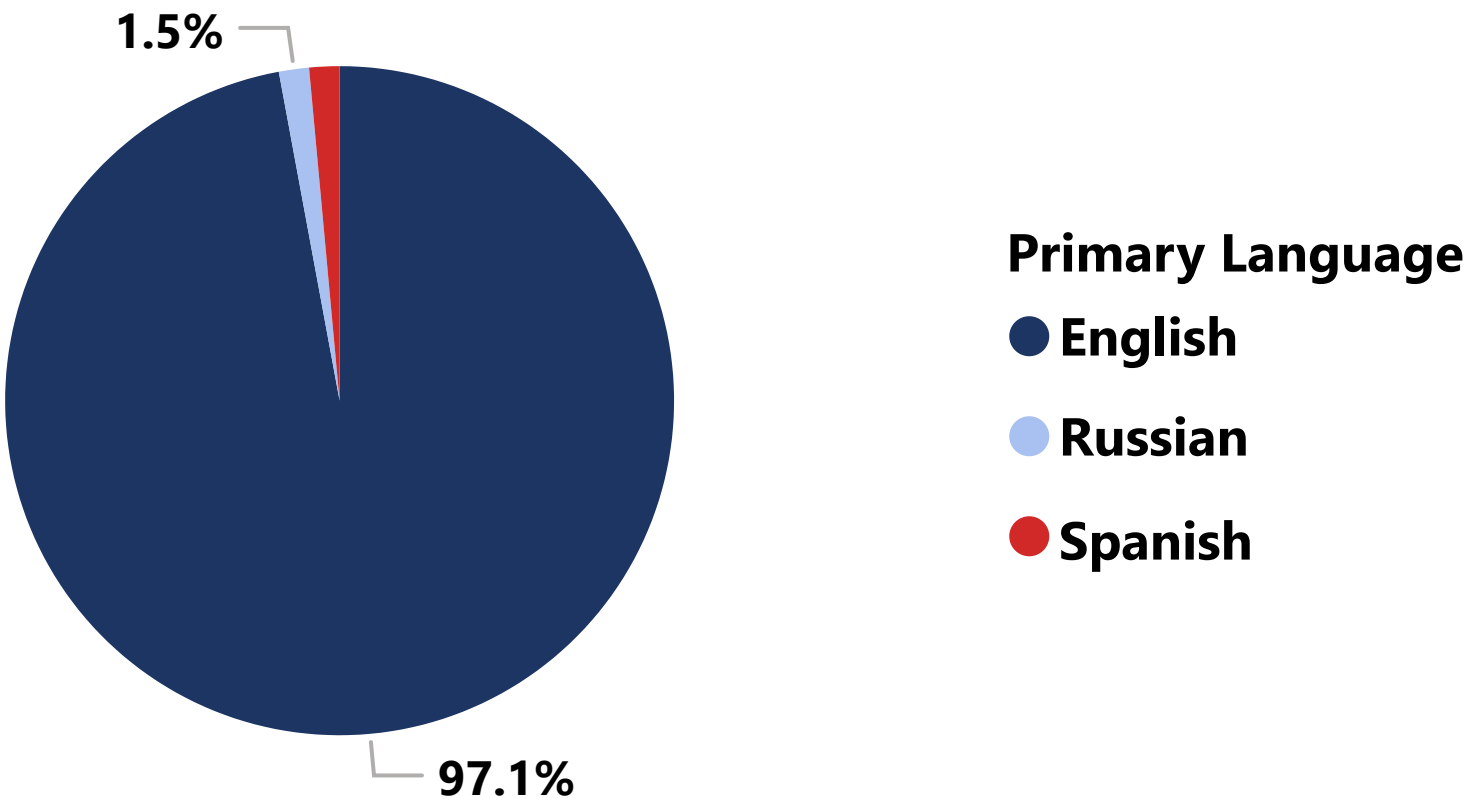

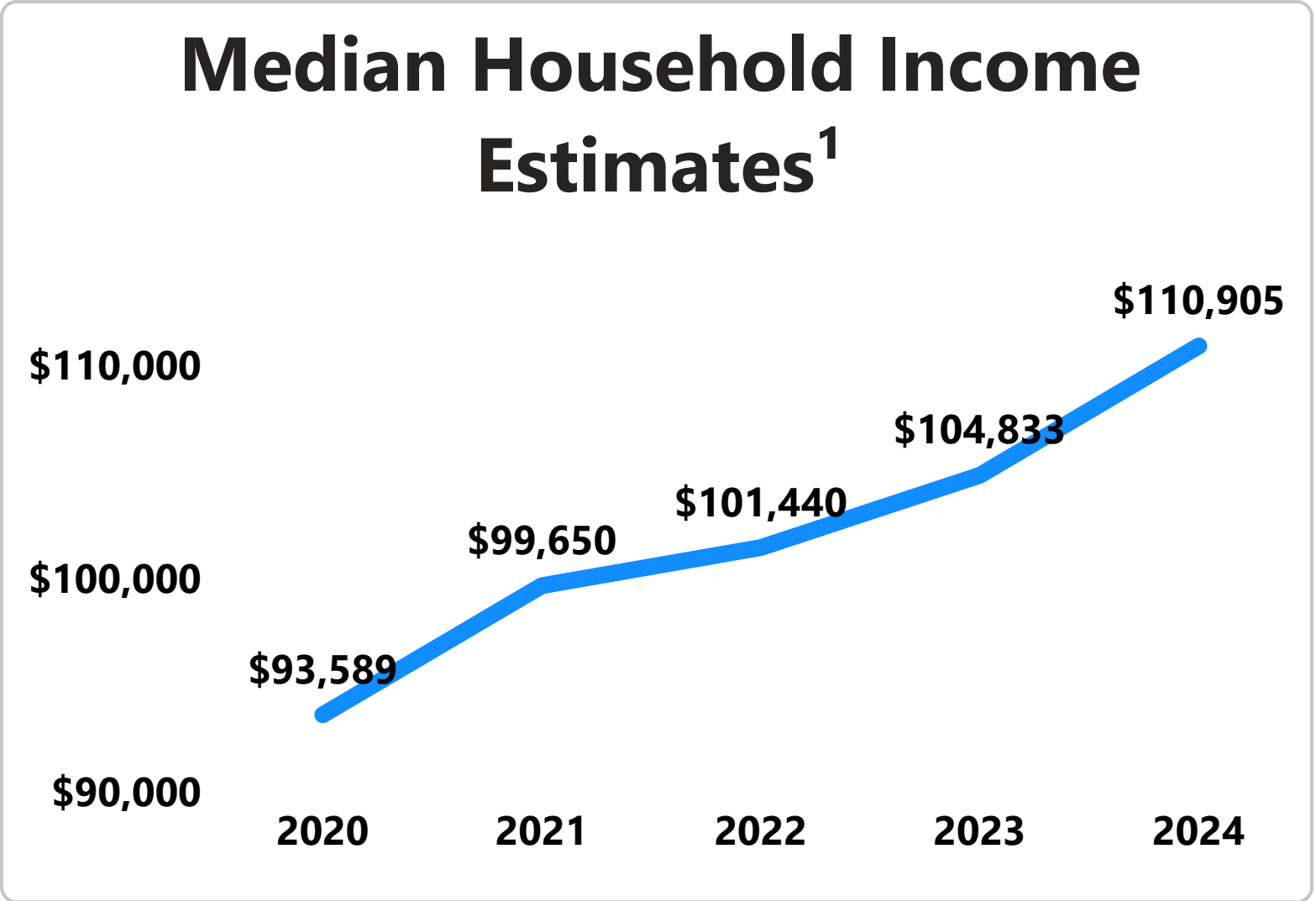
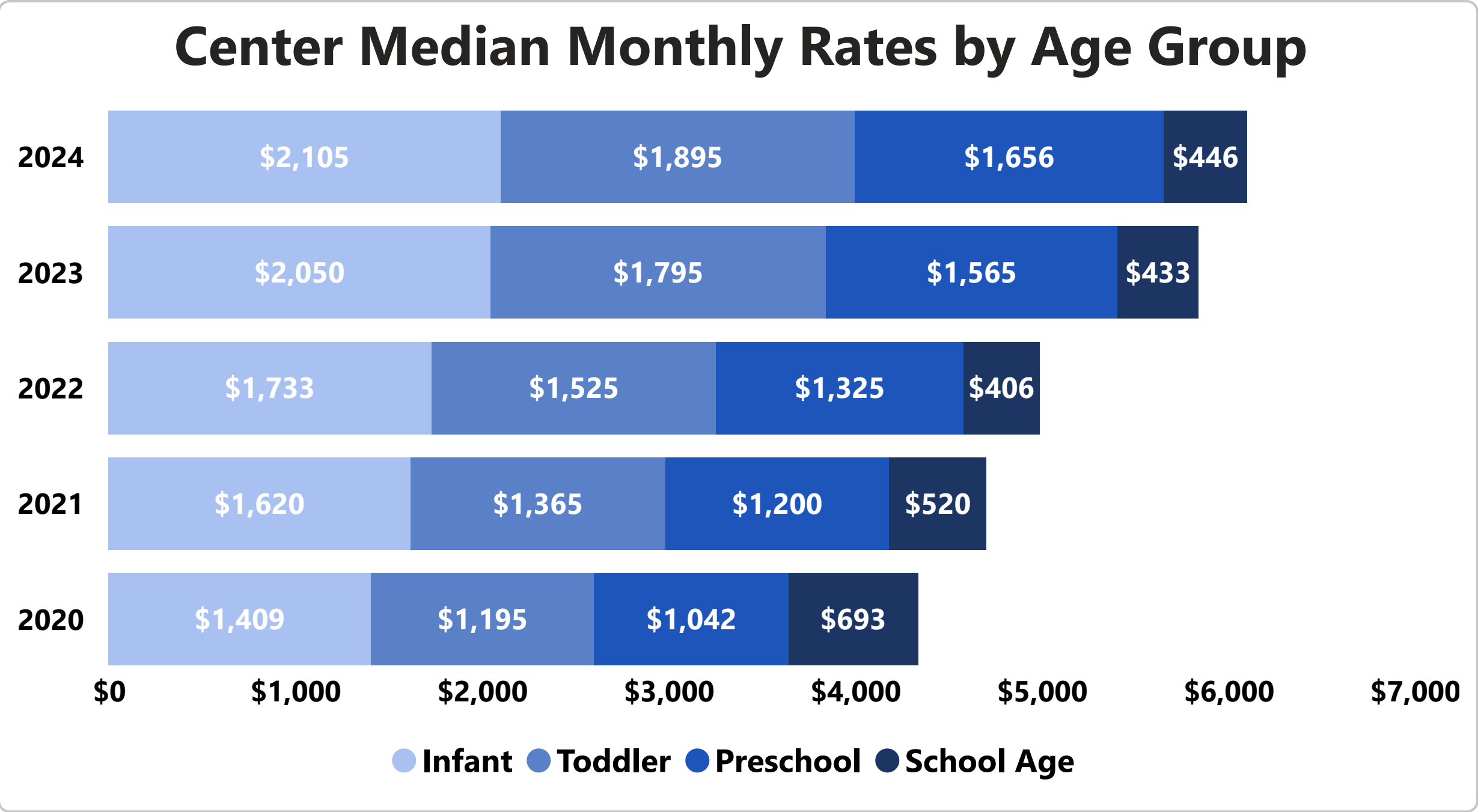


Total Child Care Capacity



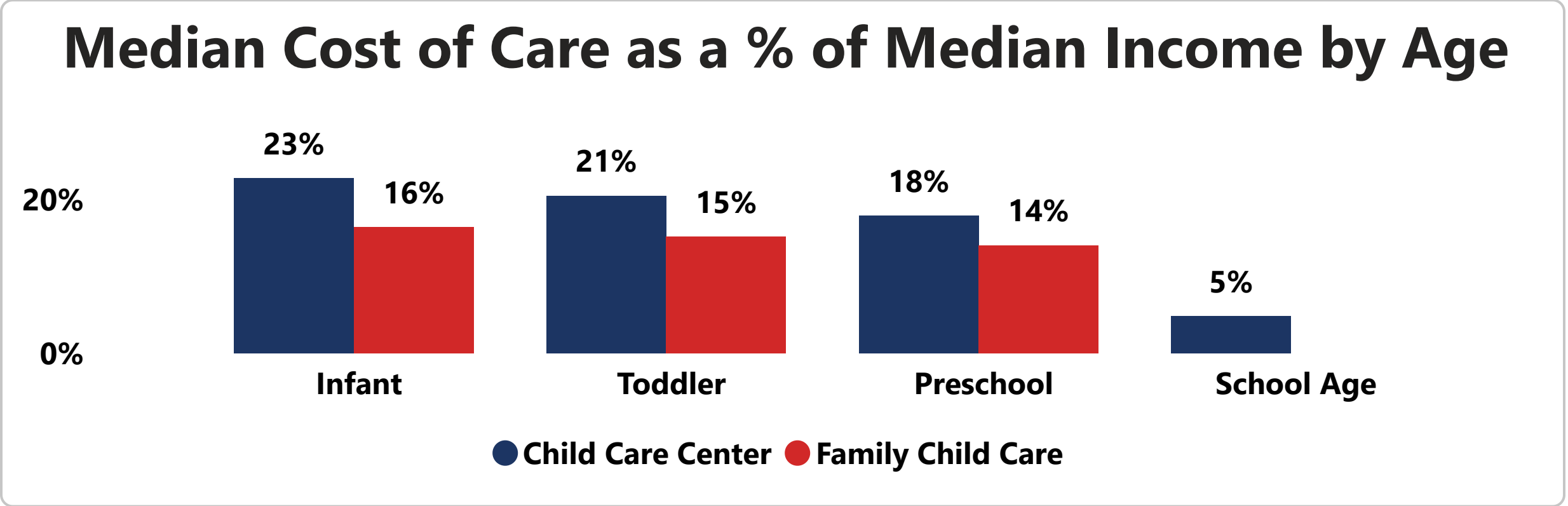
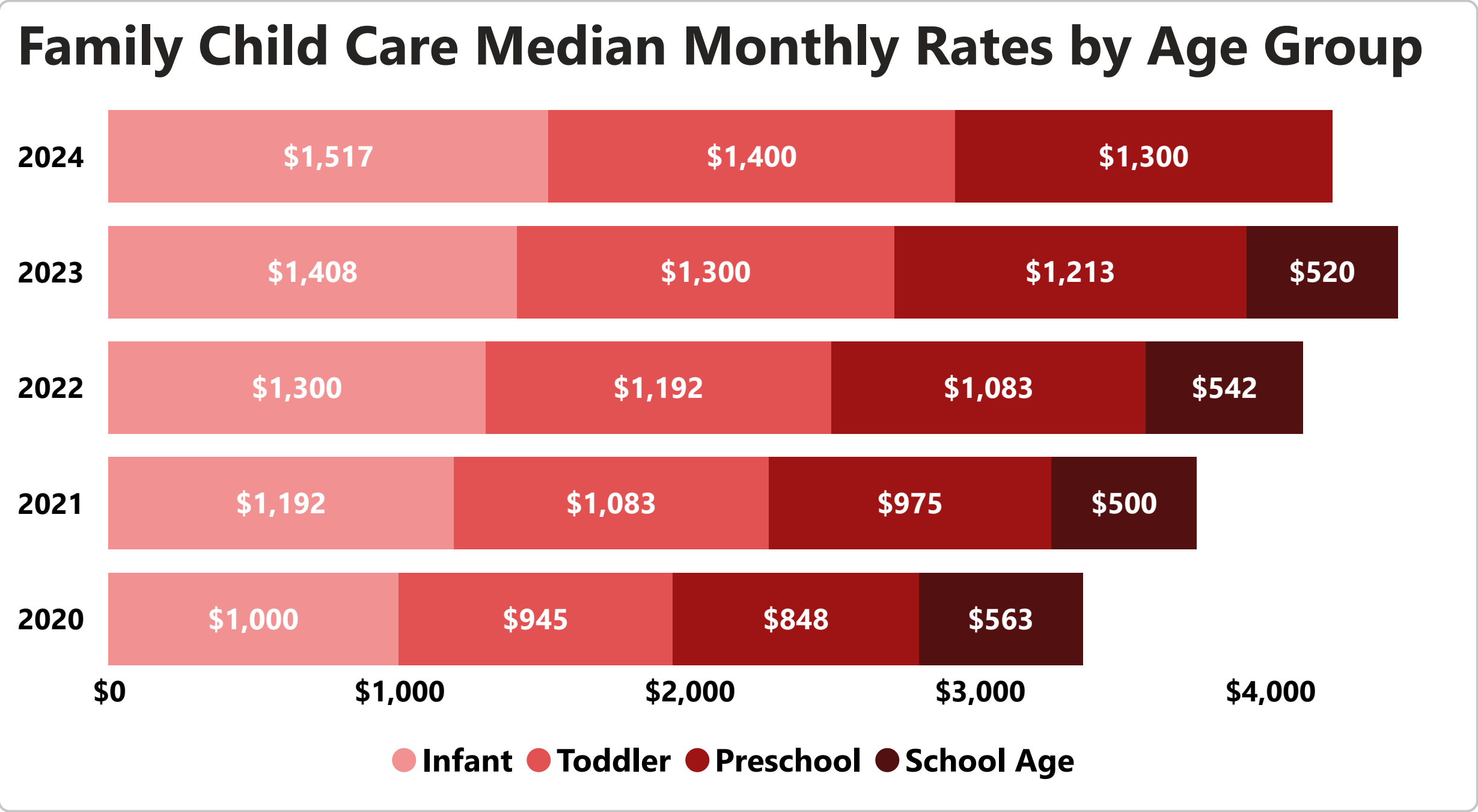

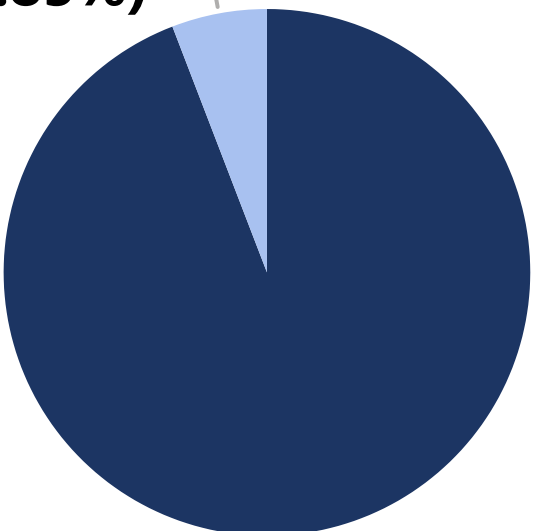

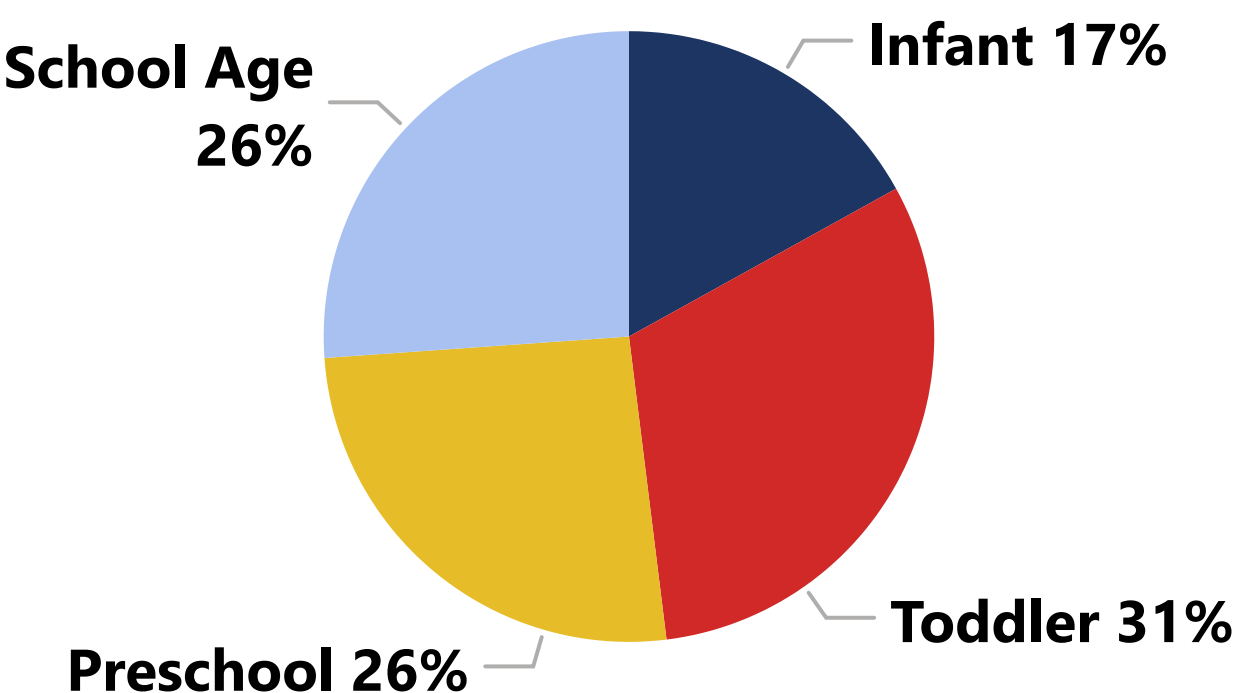

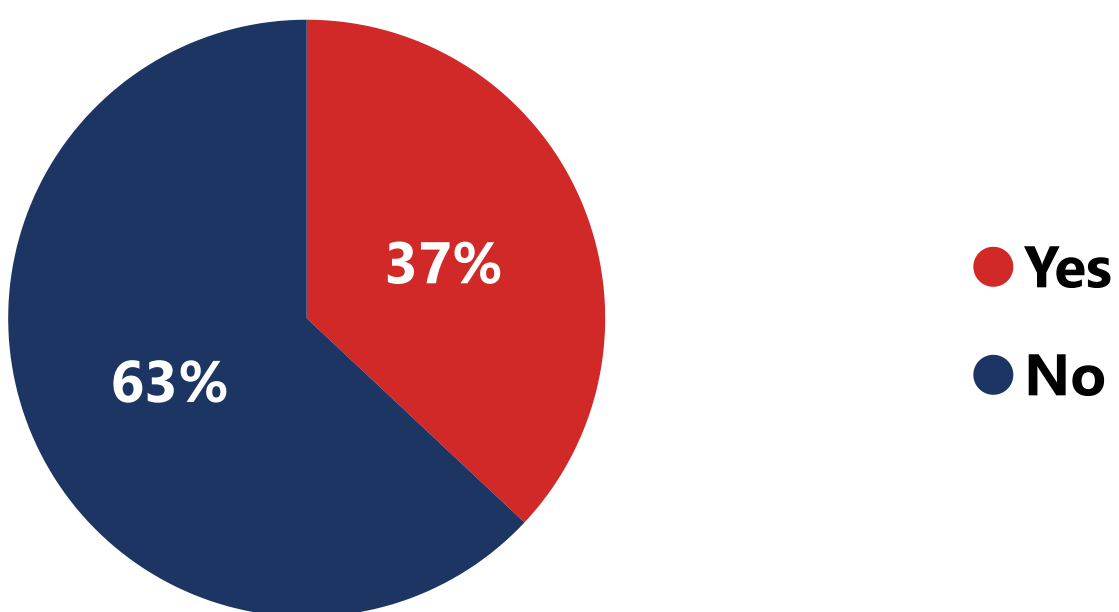

Referrals by Age Group in 2024



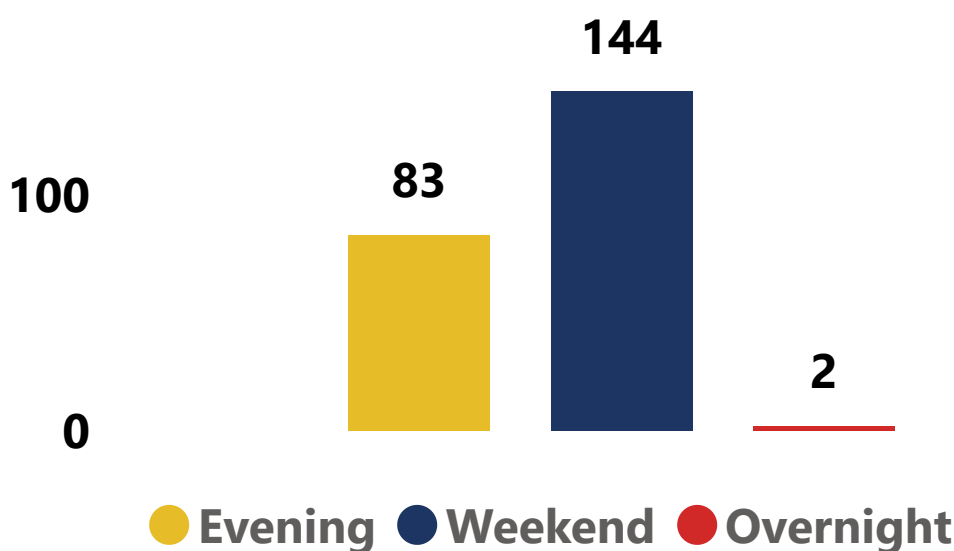
Children Using Subsidies in 2024



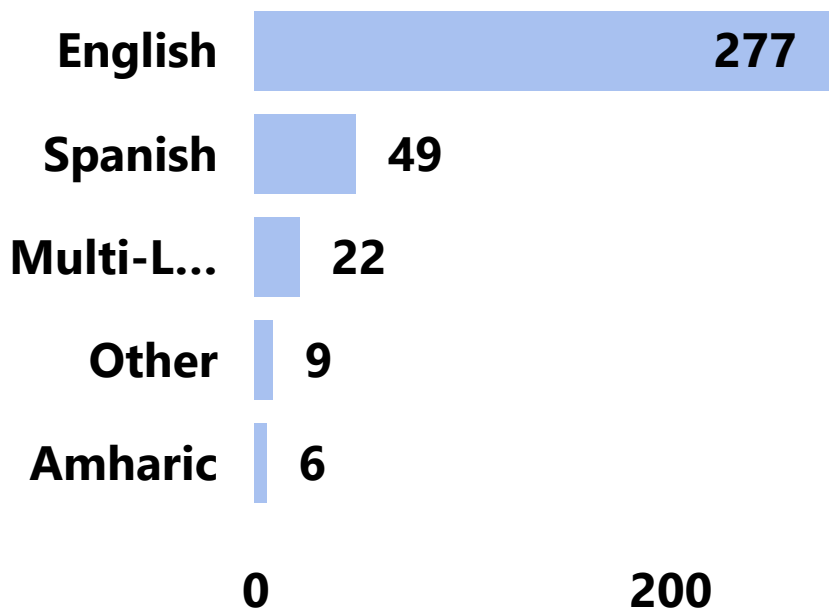

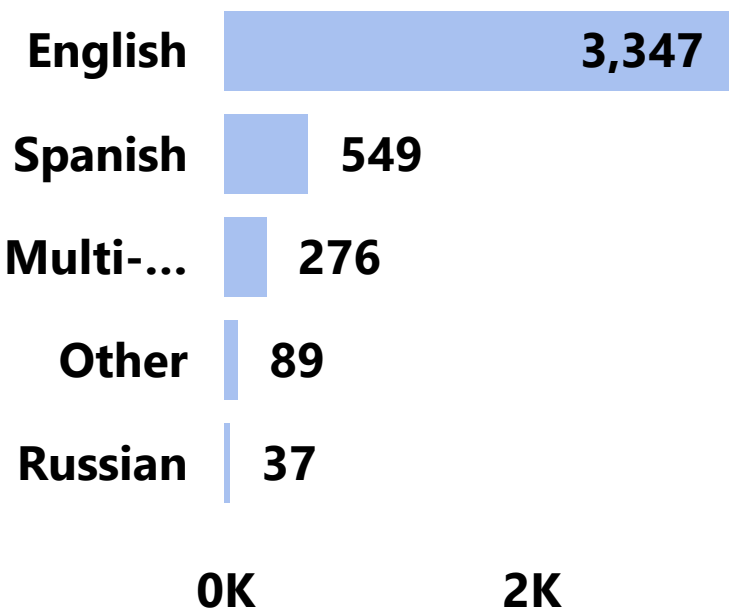
Children Needing Nonstandard Hour Care in 2024

Top Languages - Families Seeking Care in 2024 Statewide



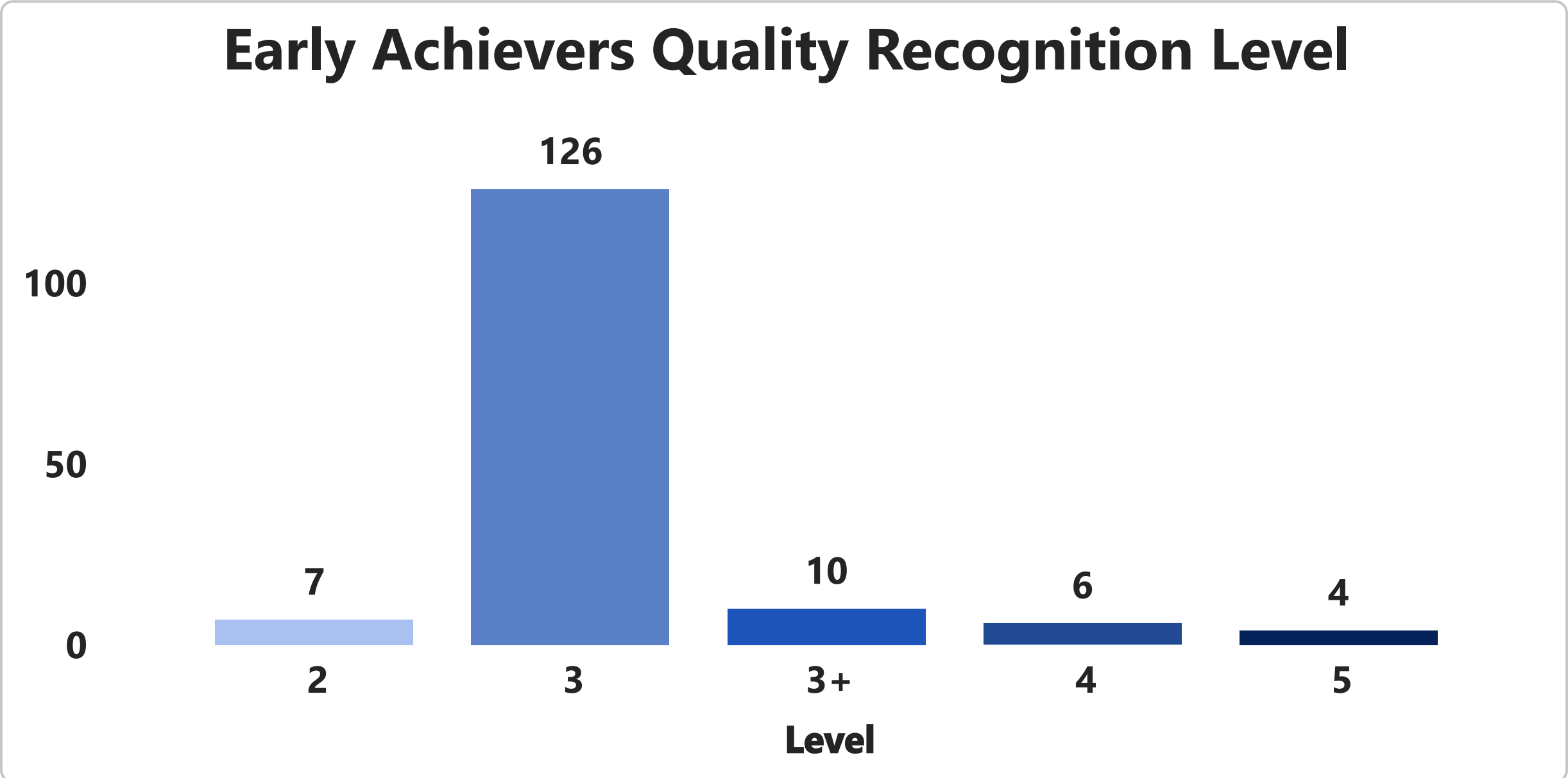
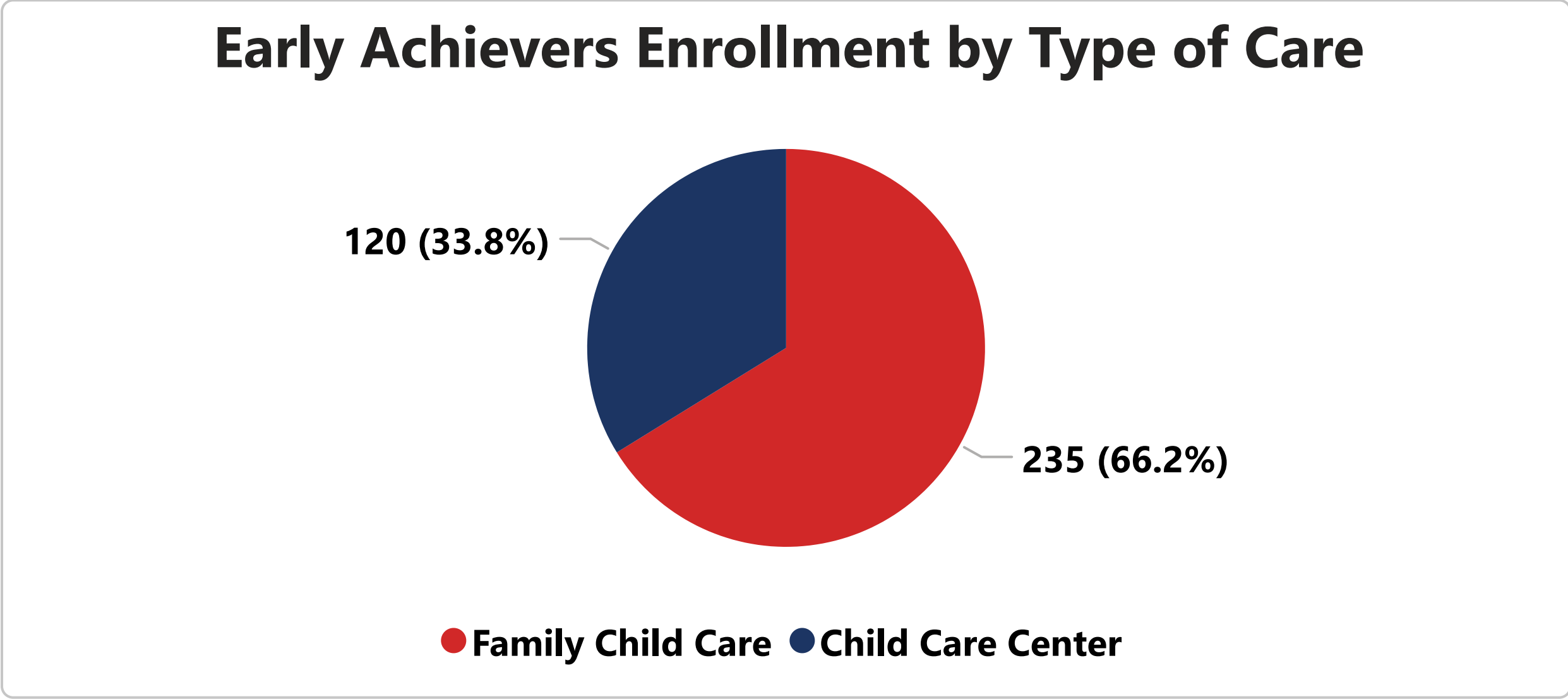
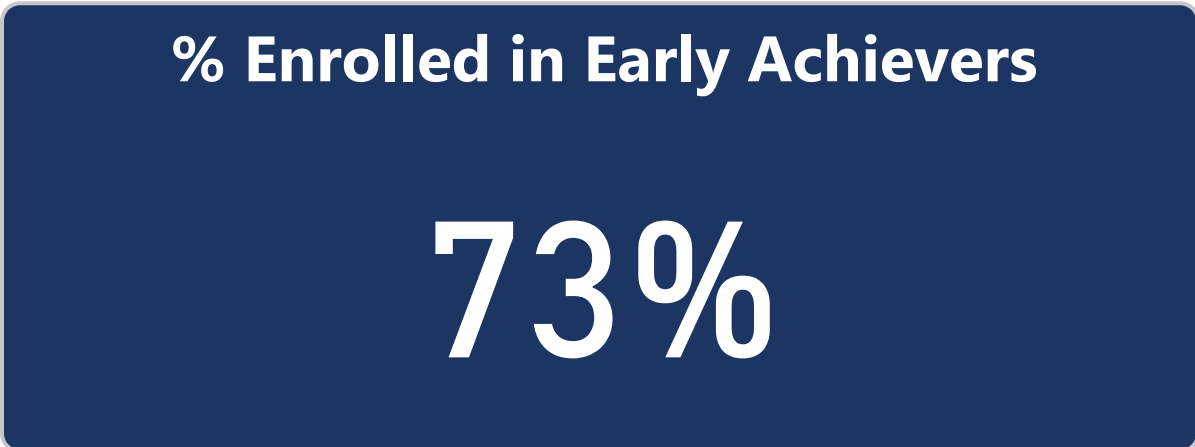
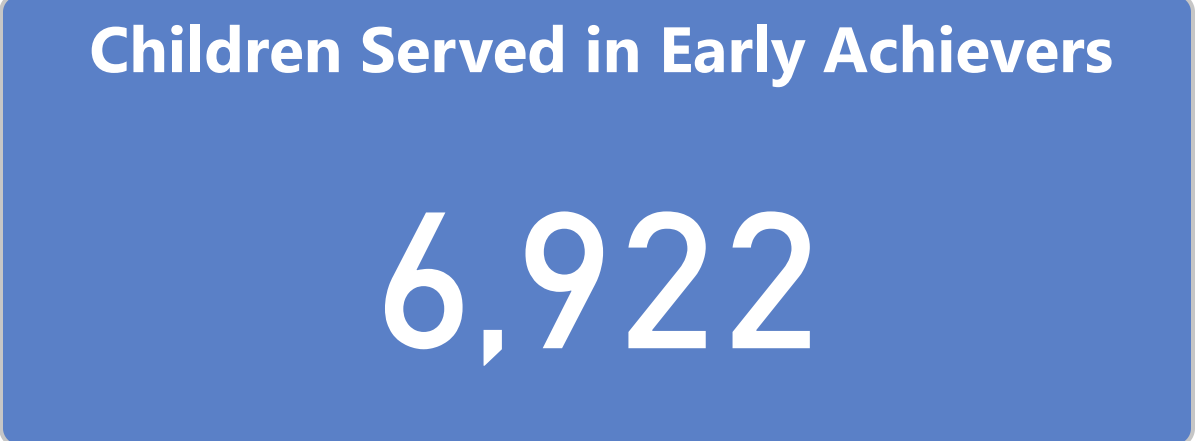
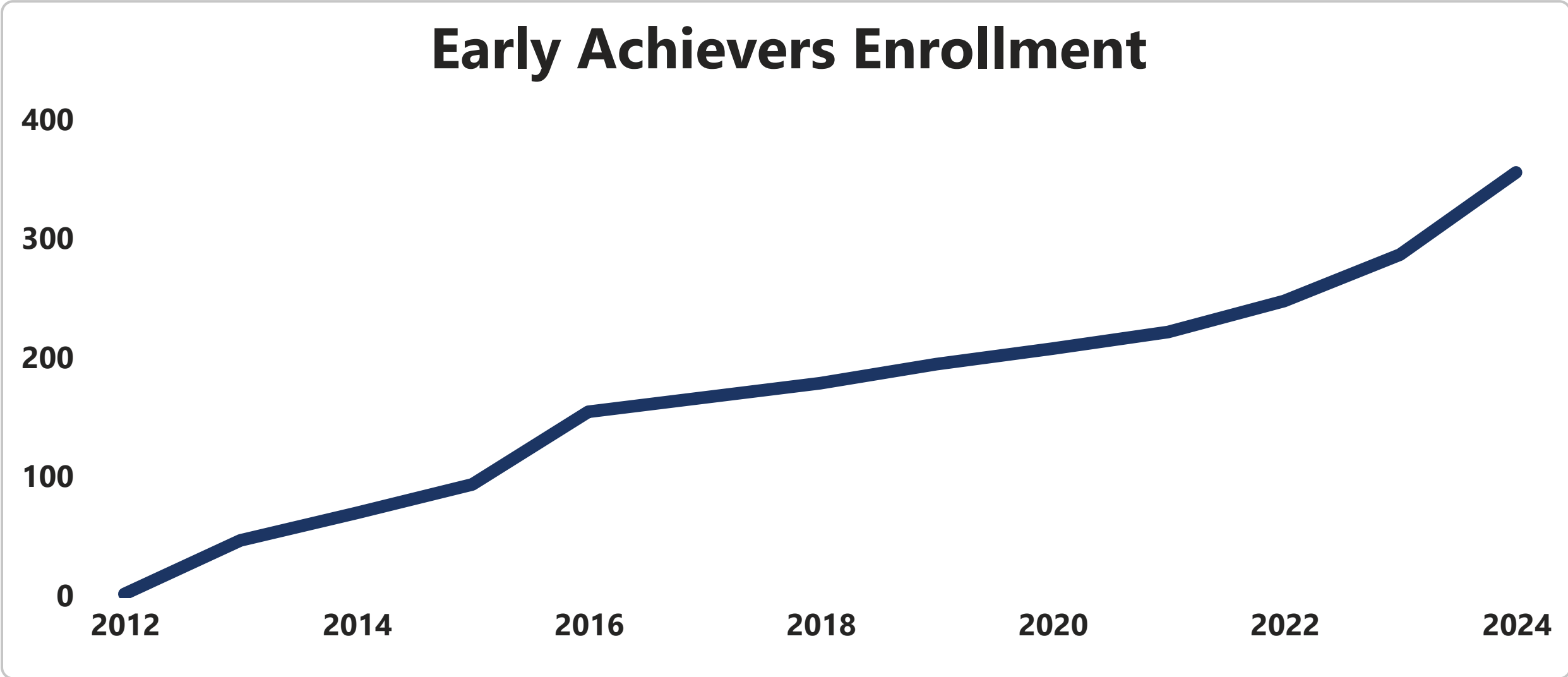
