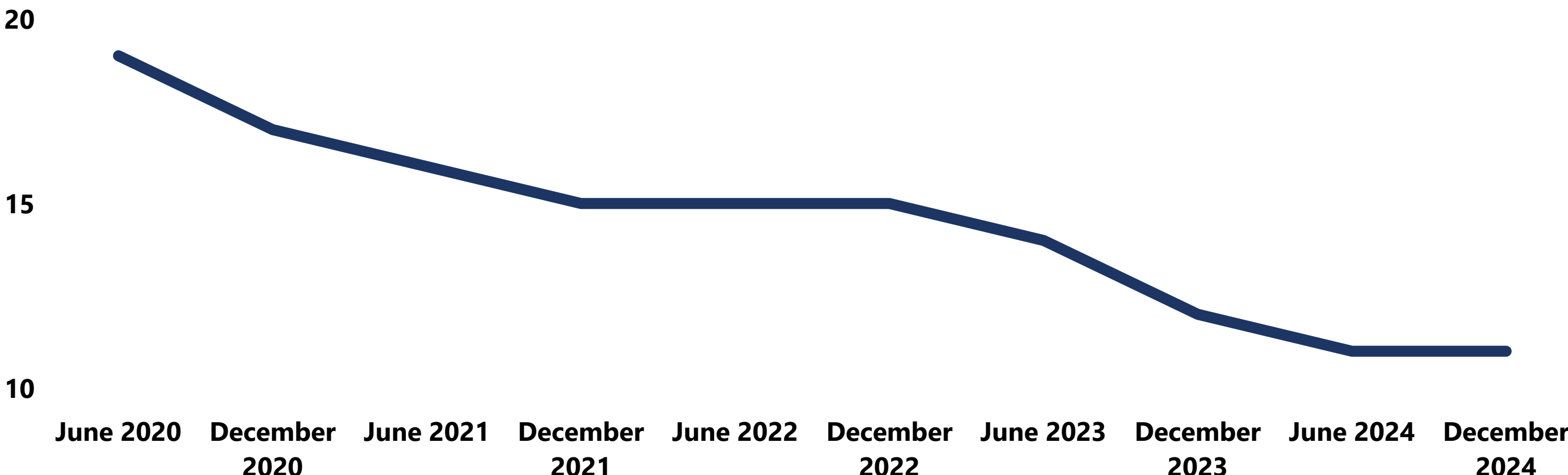

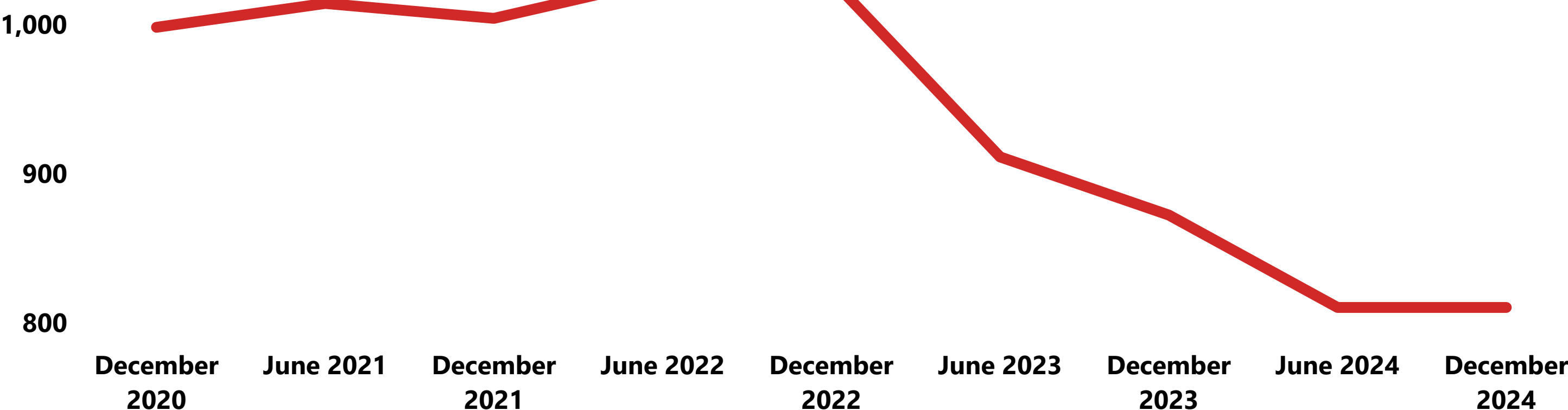

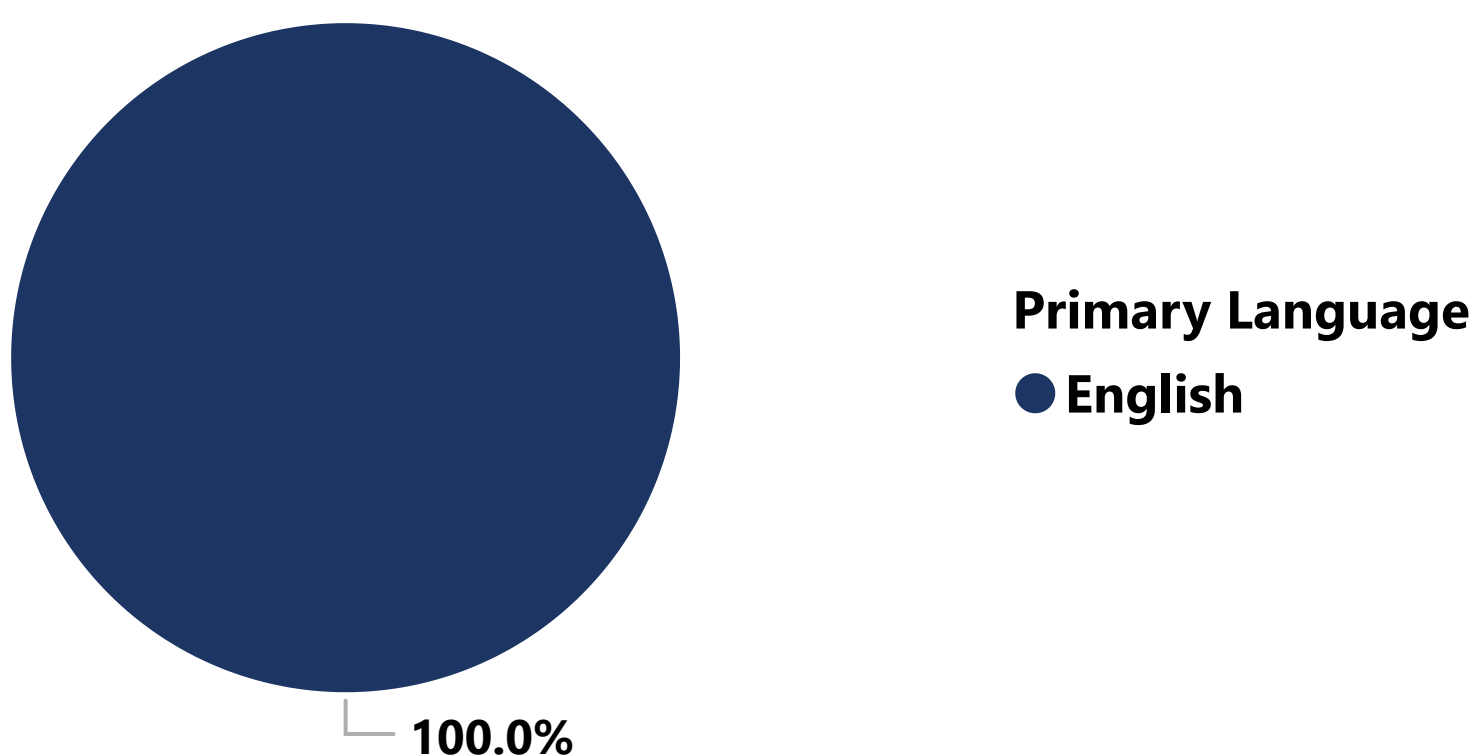
Child Care Providers by Type of Care

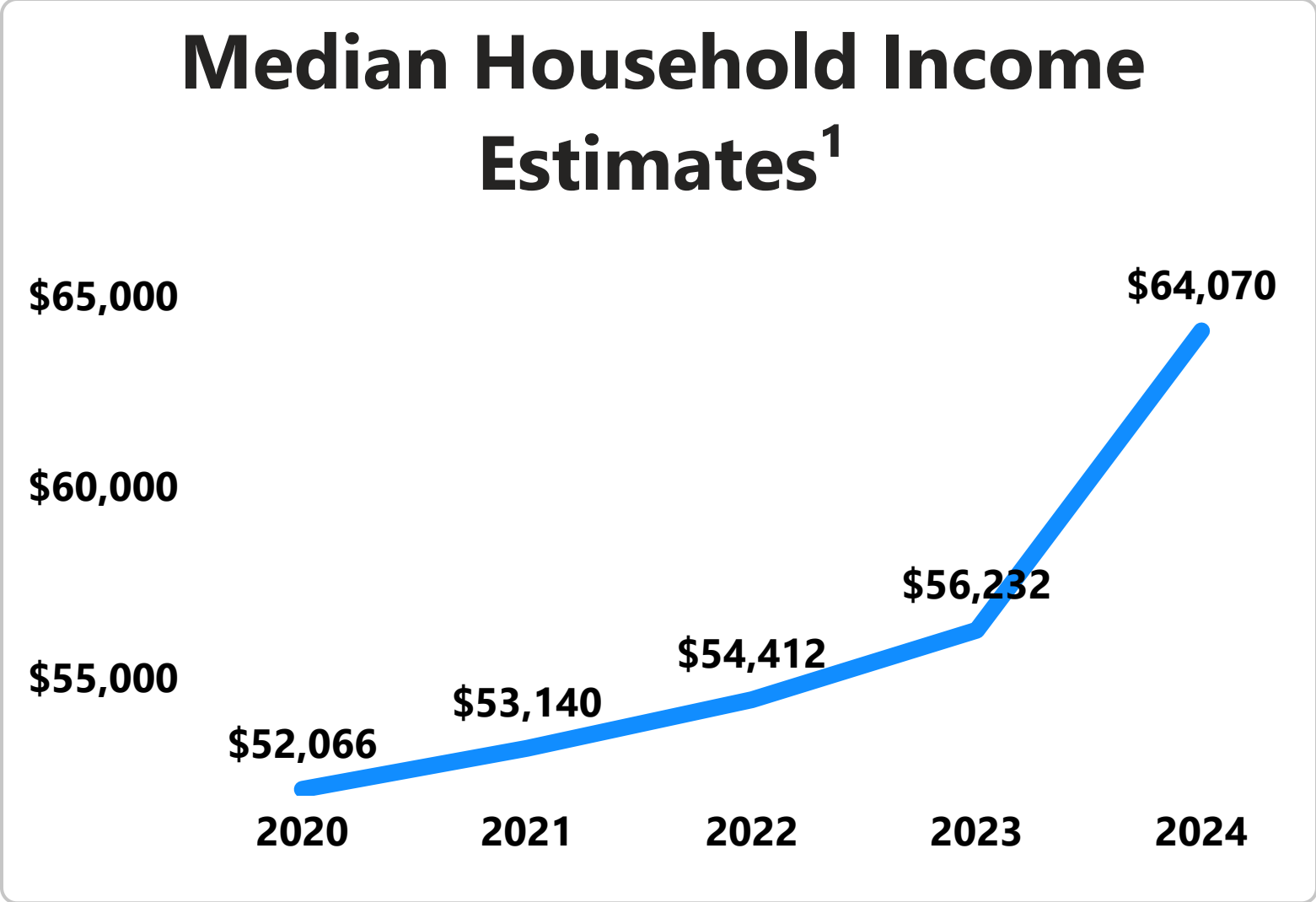
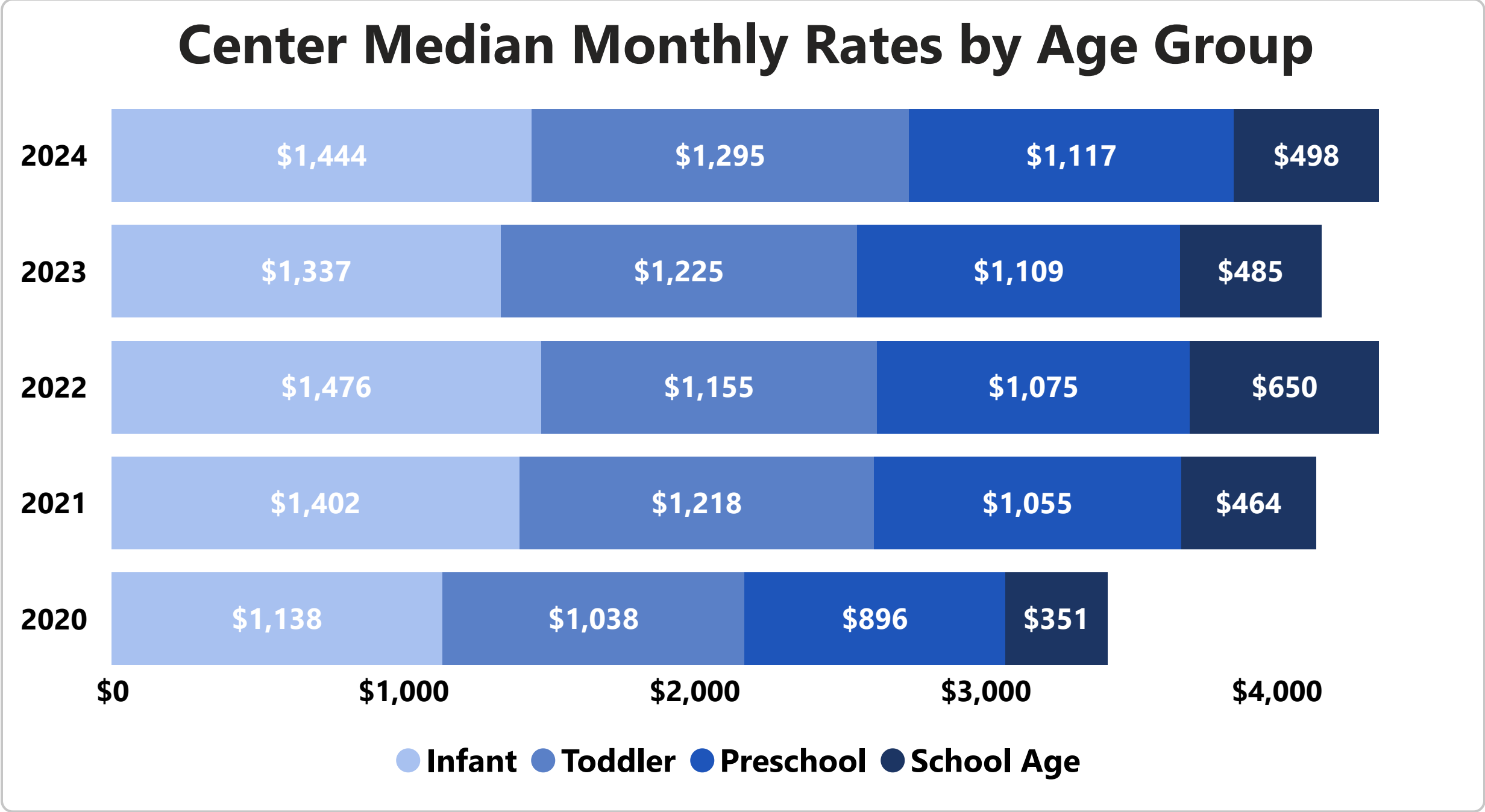


Total Child Care Capacity



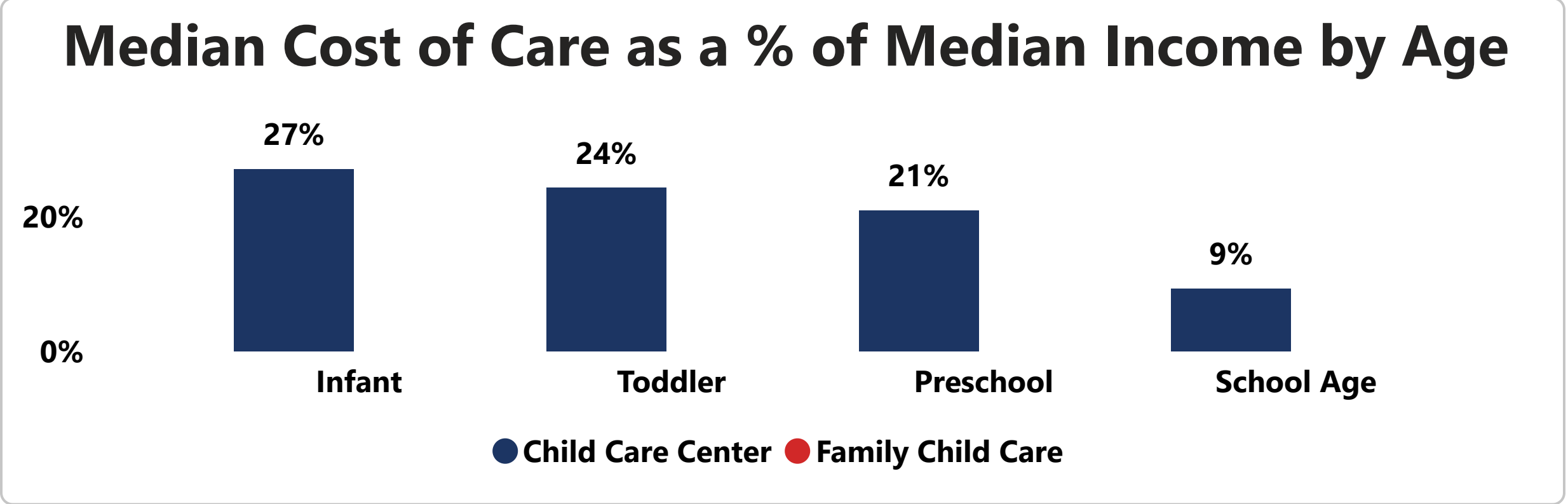
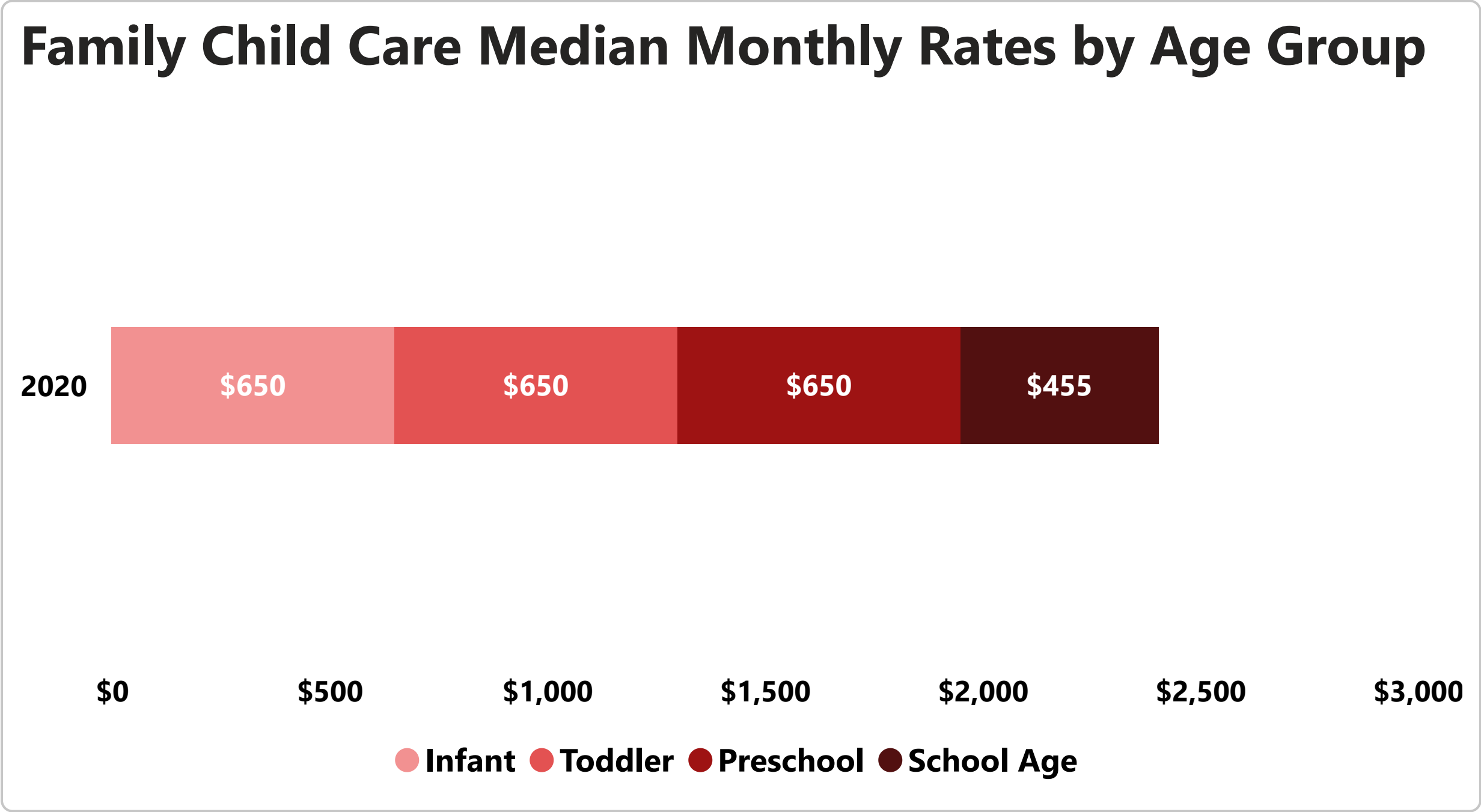

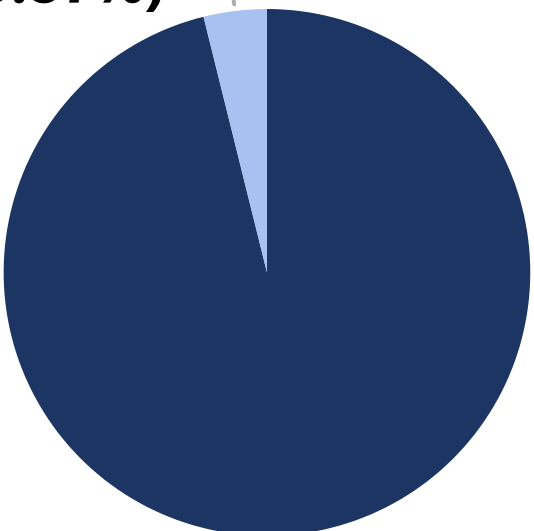

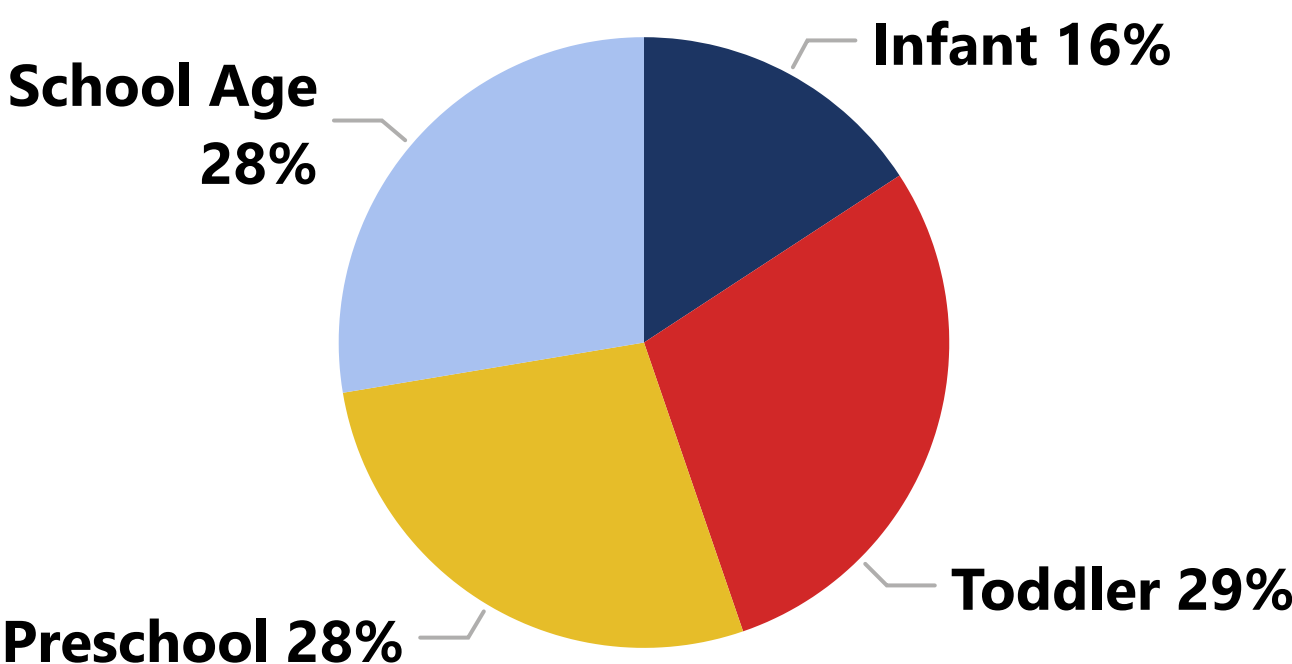

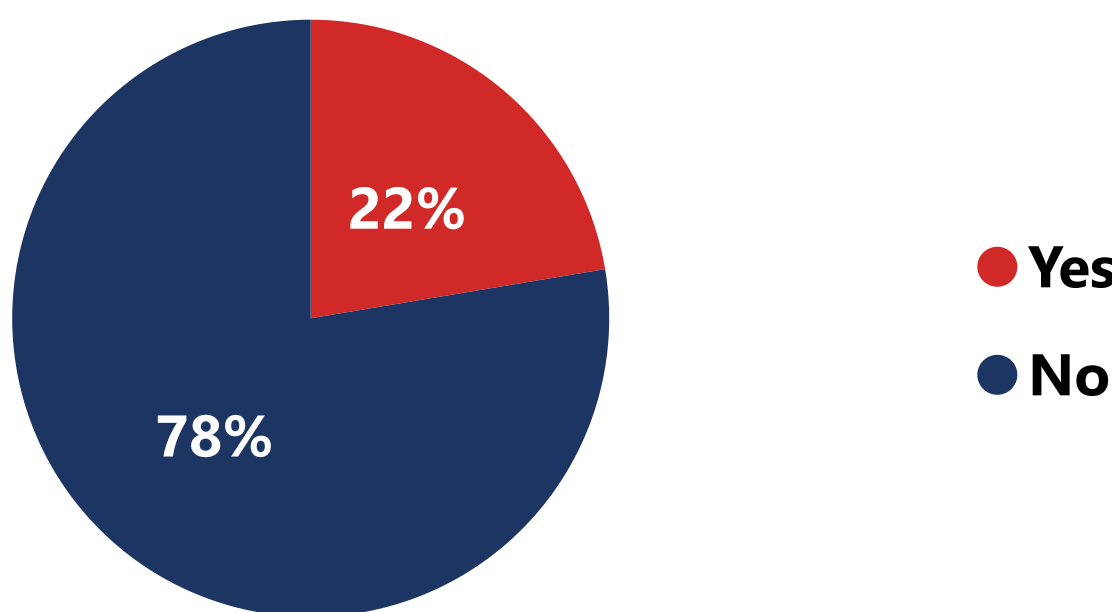

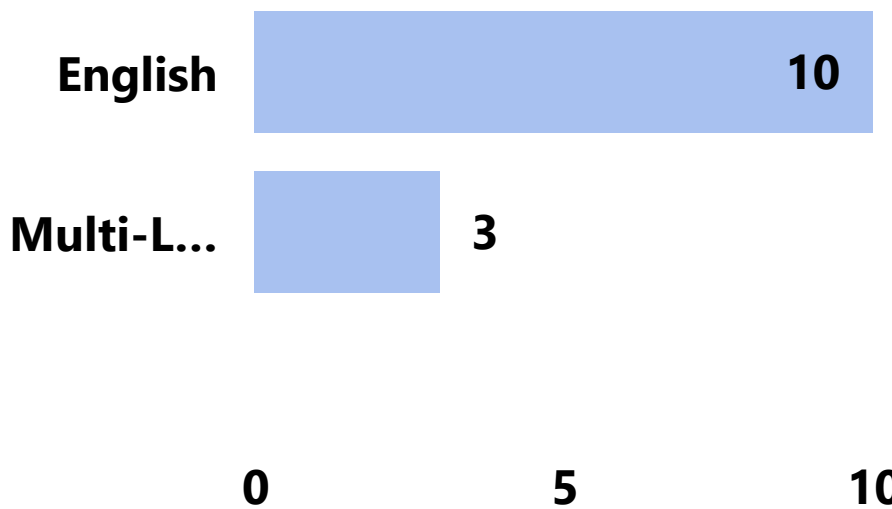

Children Needing Nonstandard Hour Care in 2024

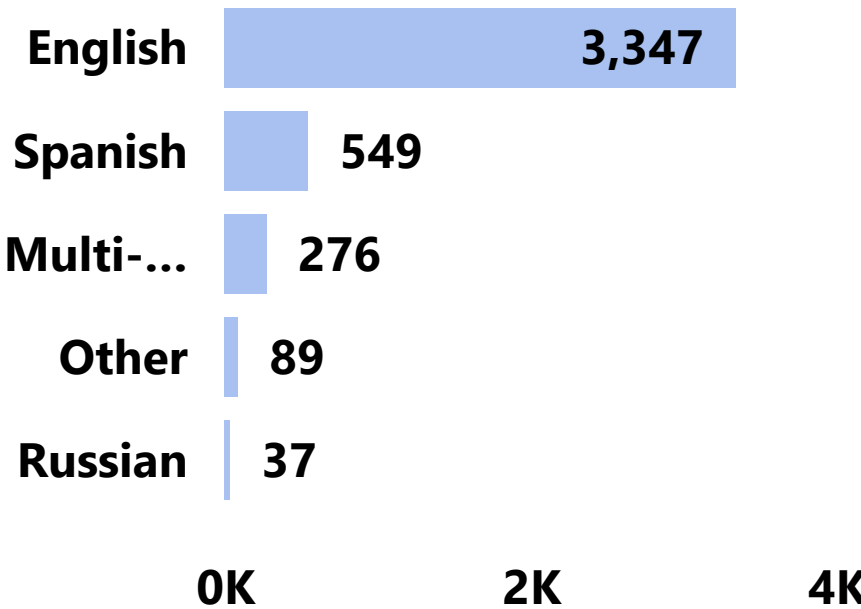

Top Languages - Families Seeking Care in 2024 Statewide



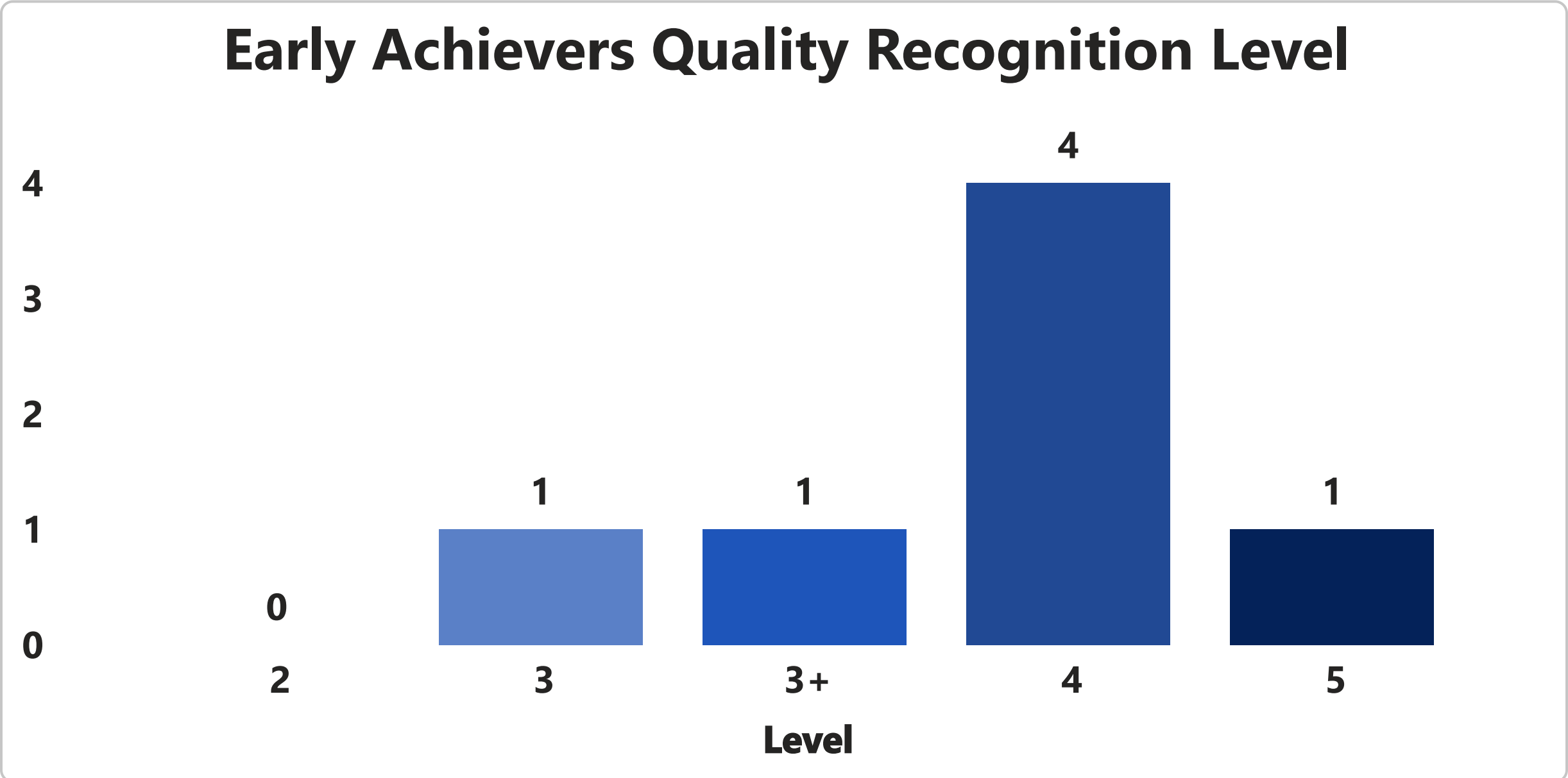
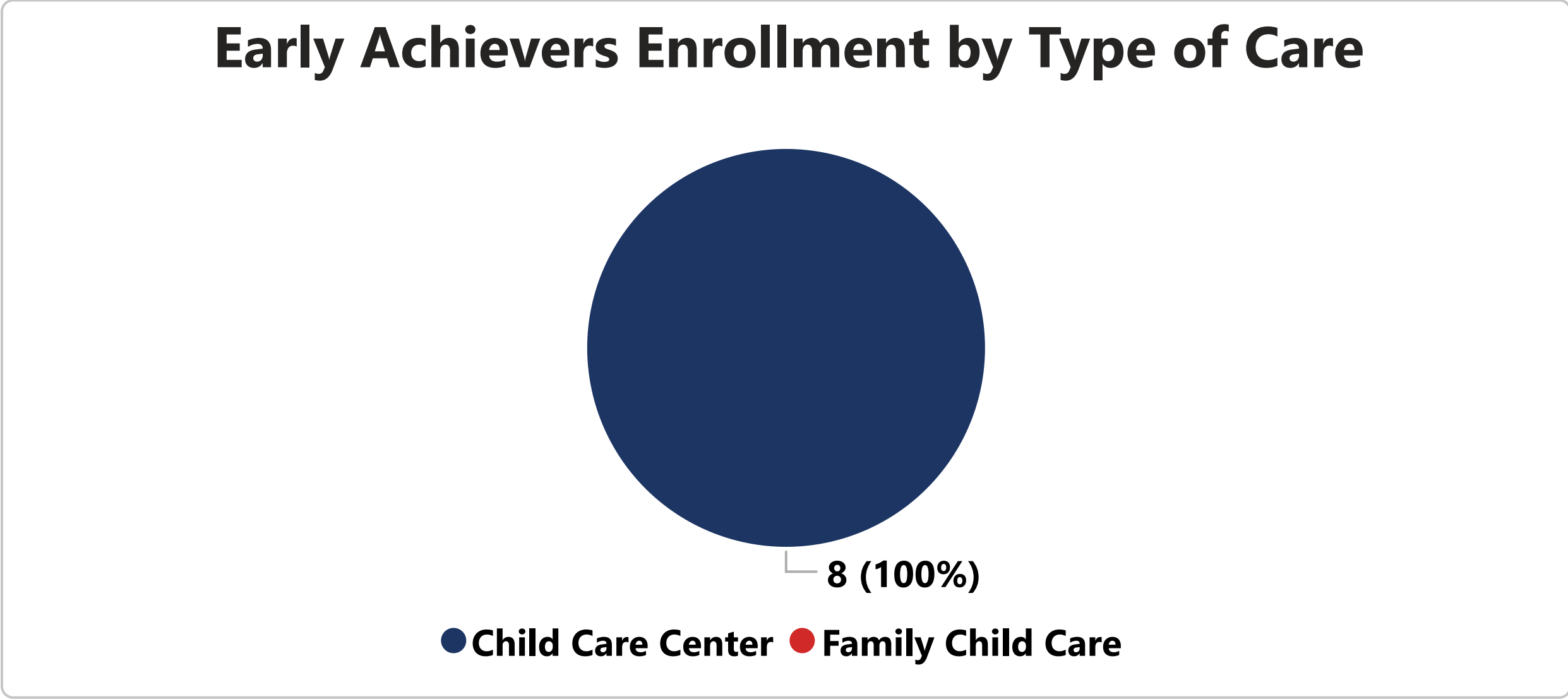
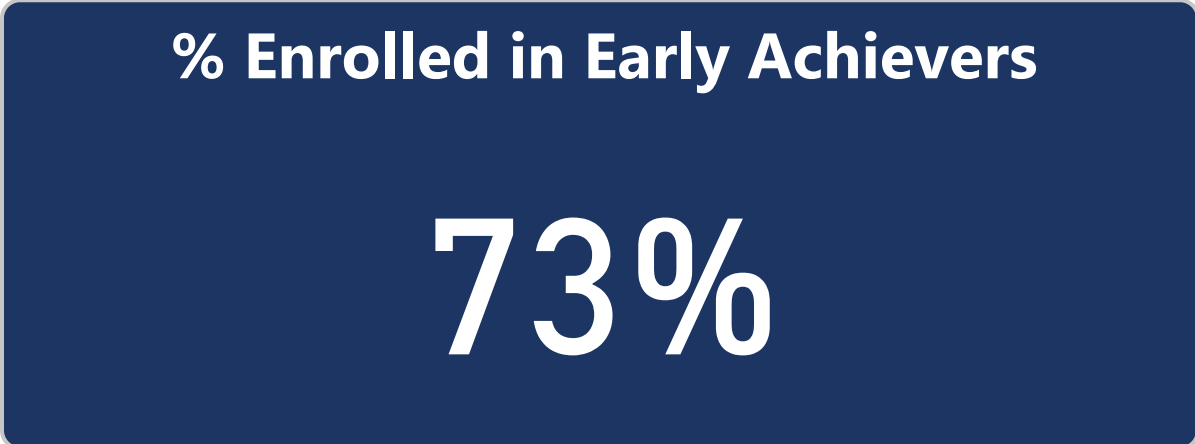
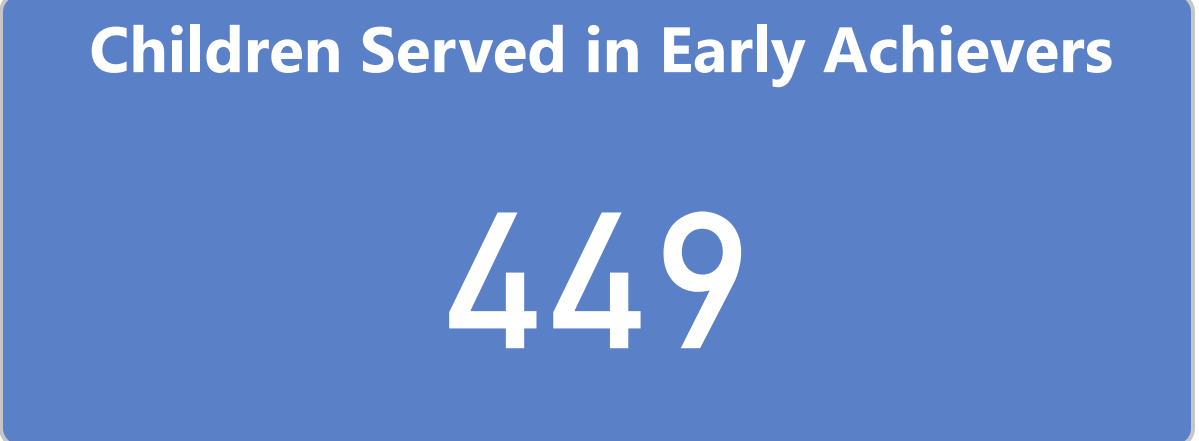
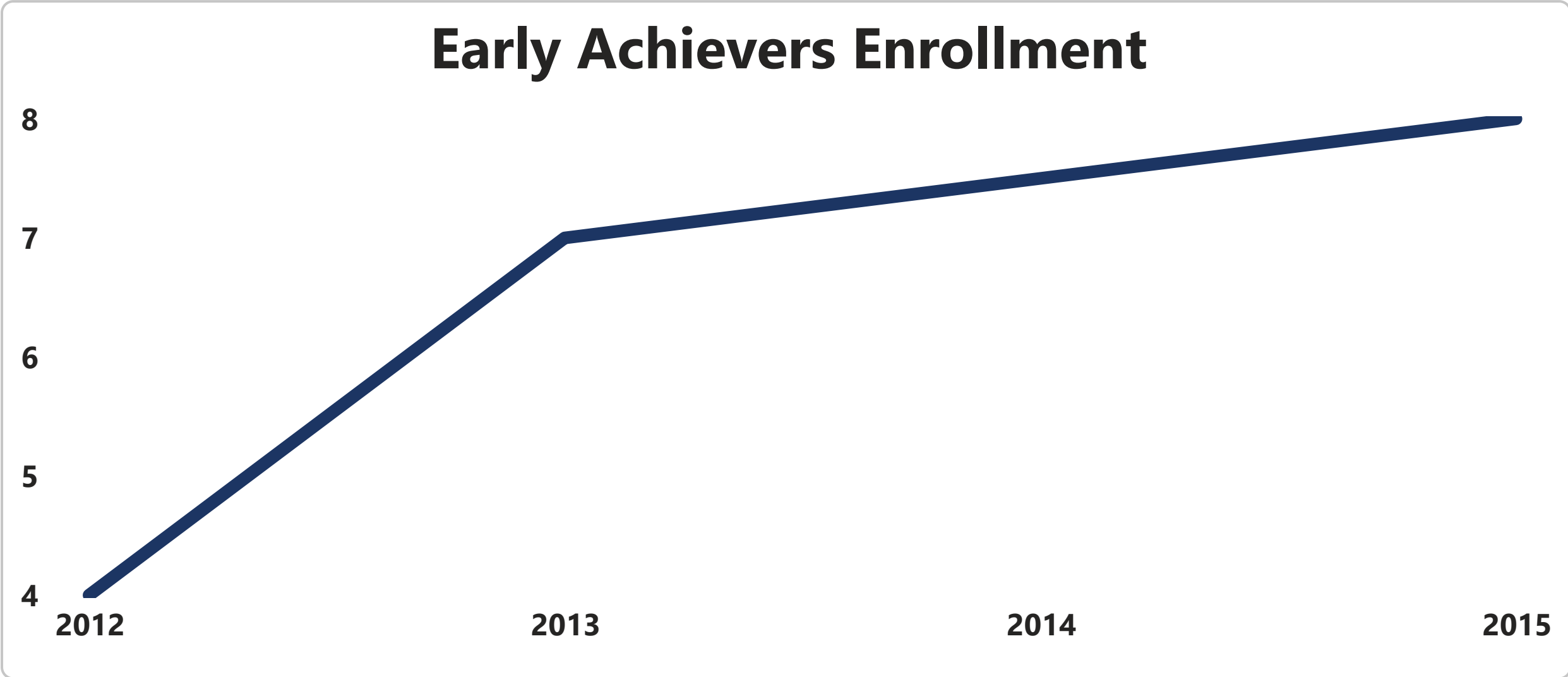
